"CLUB PERMIT" (PLATE) VEHICLES

Would all the Club Members who have vehicles on "Club Permit" (Red CH & H Plates) please take note that all "Permit Renewals", "New Permit Applications" and any related queries are to be directed through one of the three "Club Plates Authorised Permit Officers" listed here, Ken Lee – Wayne Paterson – Harry Beckwith. Their phone numbers are available under the Committee Members List on page 2 of the newsletter.

Please also note that any Member who has one or more vehicles on "Club Permit" (Plates), each such vehicle must attend at least two Club runs per financial year, according to our constitution. Exemptions from this condition for "Club Permit" vehicles must be made to the Committee, in writing, sixty days prior to the due date of the "Club Permit" renewal.

Now a point of Clarification:

The "Club Permit" is the Red CH or H Number Plate that is issued to that particular vehicle to "Permit" it to be used on a road or highway.

It "IS NOT" a "Registration" of that vehicle in the normal sense of Vehicle Registration. "IT IS" a "Permit" to use an "UNREGISTERED" vehicle, on a road or highway.

The Club Plate "Special Use Voucher", is a voucher issued for the purpose of using that "Club Permit" vehicle on a day or trip that is not a Club or sanctioned event.

There will be more news on this matter at a later date and also more news of the new proposed 90 day permit scheme for motoring clubs.

The photo (in the last n/let) on the inside back cover was taken in March 1988 at the All Ford Day display, they use to be held at the Broadmeadows Ford Factory in those days.

The cars in the photo (from R to Left) #1 is a all white 57 sedan, owned by myself, #2 is Green/white 56 sedan owned by Graham - TEX -Nevin, #3 is a all black 57 sedan owned by Adrian Rossi. #4 is a tri-colour 57 sedan owned by the late Ray Bottin (member from the 49-62 Ford Club of NSW), #5 is a cream 56 sedan owned by Veronica Schapel, #6 is a Champagne pink Star ute owned by myself.

The Customline Club was in full swing that day, with over 35 cars in attendance.....more than any other club. Above the GT and Mustang clubs we won the Trophy for Best Car Club Display that year. Ray Bottin and Allan & Lyn Morgan, members of the NSW club came down for the weekend and stayed with members of our club.

That photo was from a series we sent to various car magazines about that time. It

all came about a few years earlier when the Customline Club was in its dark days of just a dozen or so members. When the club was about 10 years old, the first generation of members had mostly lost interest or dropped out of the club to the point where in 1985/86 only 11 members remained.

I remember a committee meeting at the time discussing if the club should be resolved/closed down and what money was in the bank given to a charity. I was on the committee and still thought the club had some potential, Pat Muldoon had become President and also voted to keep it going.

I rounded up a few friends with Customlines in the eastern suburbs to join, one being Jim McCurdy who had owned Cusso's since 1961 and came with a wealth of experience.

I realised at the time if the club was to survive it needed more members and money. So starting in 1986, I began an advertising campaign in all the car magazines (that provided FREE Club ads!).

I wanted our notices to be seen above all the others on the page, so I included lots of photos of Customlines at various runs/meetings etc. Gradually people started joining up...and many of these people mentioned they didn't know of such a club and were very happy to find us! Also about this time the Footscray Fruit market swap meet was just about to start for the very first time and they provided the club with free sites to promote the club, and attract new members etc.

Slowly buy surely in the period 1986-1988 we went from 11 members to 140! Some of these blokes who joined at this time were to go onto office positions in the 1990's and keep the club going up to what it is today.

I have more photos of that Ford Day in 1988, as well as the club display at the 1st Footscray swap meet, and other runs/club functions of the time if you need some for the newsletter. I actually took on the newsletter job myself for a few years and kept a stock of interesting things for it.

Some Definitions.
