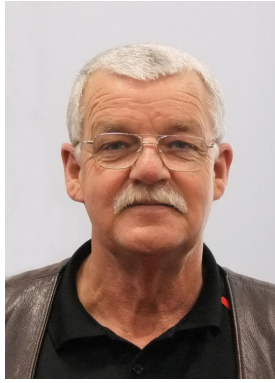

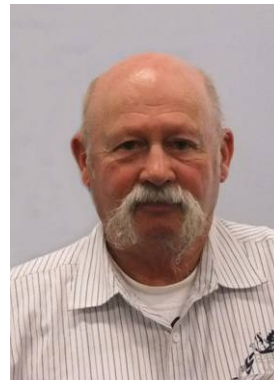

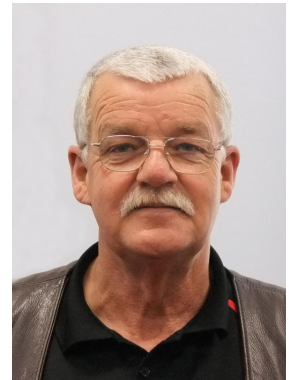

SHELDON JOHN NEWMAN. 24.10.1944 - 19.7.2013 Celebration of his life.

John was always very pleasant and easy going. He had been a Lifesaver and had flown around Australia in light aircraft and that seemed to be a passion of his. 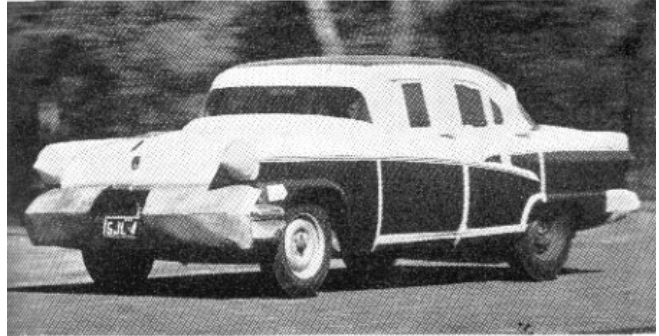

Len Lukey - Customline

Len Lukey's Customline at the BP/COR National Land Speed Record attempts outside Coonabarabran September 28-29 1957. It got up to 130mph, but with a 2-way average still recorded 123.38mph.

This was Lukey's favoured Customline that he first raced in 1955, he spun it into the hay bales, from the lead, on the last corner of the last lap in a Sedan Race at Albert Park November 1956, pancaked the roof when he rolled it at Phillip Island early



1957 and subsequently rebuilt it with the trim from a '56 Customline. It was while this Customline (GJL.432) was being rebuilt that he purchased and drove another '56 (GPN.057) which was pale green and appeared at the '57 AGP meeting at Caversham and at the Moomba races at Albert Park in early 1957.



It probably needed all that tape to stop it from blowing apart at those speeds. Ed.

The photo, at left, is hanging on the wall of the Phillip Island Car Museum and the Cussy is GJL-432.

At left is a photo of Len Lukey's Customline on display in the Phillip Island Car Museum.

As you can see it is definitely a '56 model, and the rego is GJL-432.



These vehicles were driven to the race tracks, flogged to death on the track, and then driven home, if still in one piece.

Carburetors Suck

A carburetor (American and Canadian), carburator, carburettor, or carburetter (Commonwealth spelling) is a device that blends air and fuel for an internal combustion engine. It is sometimes, but not always, shortened to carb or carby in America, the United Kingdom and Australia.

History and development

The Carburetor was invented by an Italian, Luigi De Cristoforis in 1876. A carburetor was developed by Enrico Bernardi at the University of Padua in 1882, for his "Motrice Pia", the first petrol combustion engine (one cylinder, 1,225 cc) prototyped on 5 August 1882. A carburetor was among the early patents by Karl Benz as he developed internal combustion engines and their components. Early carburetors were the surface carburetor type, in which air is charged with



fuel by being passed over the surface of gasoline.

The world's first carburetor for the stationary engine was invented by the Hungarian engineers János Csonka and Donát Bánki in 1893. Parallel to this, the Austrian automobile pioneer Siegfried Marcus invented the rotating brush carburetor. Frederick William Lanchester of Birmingham, England, experimented with the wick carburetor in cars. In 1896,

Frederick and his brother built the first gasoline driven car in England, a single cylinder 5 hp (3.7 kW) internal combustion engine with chain drive. Unhappy with the performance and power, they re-built the engine the next year into a two cylinder horizontally opposed version using his new wick carburetor design.

In 1885, Wilhelm Maybach and Gottlieb Daimler developed a float carburetor for their engine based on the atomizer nozzle. Carburetors were the usual method of fuel delivery for most US-made gasoline-fueled engines up until the late 1980s, when fuel injection became the preferred method. In Australia, some cars continued to use carburetors well into the 1990s. Elsewhere, certain Lada cars used carburetors until 2006. Many motorcycles still use carburetors for simplicity's sake, since a carburetor does not

require an electrical system to function. Carburetors are still found in small engines and in older or specialized automobiles, such as those designed for stock car racing, though NASCAR's 2011 season was the last one with carbureted engines; electronic fuel injection is used beginning with the 2012 race season.

The carburetor works on Bernoulli's principle: the faster air moves, the lower its static pressure, and the higher its dynamic pressure. The throttle (accelerator) linkage does not directly control the flow of liquid fuel. Instead, it actuates carburetor mechanisms which meter the flow of air being pulled into the engine. The speed of this flow,

and therefore its pressure, determines the amount of fuel drawn into the airstream.

Beginning in the late 1930s, downdraft carburetors were the most popular type for automotive use in the United States. In Europe, the sidedraft carburetors replaced downdraft as free space in the engine bay decreased and the use of the SU-type carburetor (and similar units from other manufacturers) increased. Some small propeller-driven aircraft engines still use the updraft carburetor design.

I will leave this subject here, but a whole Newsletter could be written on the Carburettor. Ed.

The Club Permit Scheme

21-July 2013

At the Club Meeting on the 21 July 2013 the Club approved the following Club Permit Scheme amendments to the rules of obtaining a Club Permit through the Club, to better serve the scheme, which I have outlined as below.

Les Cross. Club Permit Officer.

- 1.** A Person wishing to have a vehicle approved for a Club Permit must first be a Current Financial Member of the Club.
- 2.** A Member's first vehicle to be approved for a Club Permit must be a Ford Customline, not any other vehicle.
- 3.** If a Member already owns a Ford Customline, which has Full VicRoads Registration, then the first vehicle approved for a Club Permit does not have to be a Ford Customline.
- 4.** A Financial Member of the Club can then apply to have a vehicle approved for a Club Permit by applying to the Club, IN PERSON, at a Club Meeting or by contacting no less than four committee members, to have their vehicle and permit approved.
A Member must also have with them all the appropriate documentation, which includes the requirement of supplying a Current Roadworthy Certificate and a Current Photograph of the vehicle, otherwise the permit may not be approved.
- 5.** There is no limit to the number of vehicles a Member may have approved for a Club Permit.
- 6.** It is the Members full responsibility to comply with all the rules, regulations and requirements as set down by the Club and by VicRoads, whilst using the Club Permitted vehicle.
It is also a Club requirement that any member who owns a Club Permitted vehicle has to attend at least two Club Meetings or Runs per year.
It is also the Members responsibility to ensure that their Club Membership and their Club Permit is currently paid up, otherwise their Club Permit may become invalid.

Documentation includes:

A current Roadworthy Certificate, filled out and signed.
The Clubs, Club Permit Application Form, all filled out.
The VicRoads Application Form, all filled out.

For further information you can contact the Club Permit Officer on his phone as listed on page 2 of the Clubs Newsletter.

PLEASE NOTE:

A Spouse or Partner of a Financial Member is deemed also to be a financial member, providing that the Spouse or Partner remains the financial member.

If that Financial Member becomes Un-financial with vehicles on the CPS, under that membership, then those Club Permits will become Invalid and will be removed from the CPS by VicRoads.

If a member sells or disposes of the first Customline then any other vehicles on the CPS that are not Customlines will not be eligible to remain on the CPS and VicRoads will be notified and they will then cancel those Club Permits pertaining to that membership.

To keep those other vehicles on the CPS another Customline with Full VicRoads Registration or a Club Permit would need to be acquired as the first vehicle before those other vehicles can be kept on or put on the CPS.
