

We won a \$150 voucher with the Club Display so we will get the club logo on them, so keep an eye open for the new look.




Billy is working well, so if people would stop getting him to do other jobs (Kevin), it will be ready for Kaniva - won't it Billy??!!!






CUSSY CLUB XMAS PARTY 2014
